PROCEDURE OF ADMISSION

NUMBER OF ADMISSIONS:

The College has 60 seats for B.Pharm. Degree course. As the College is having Gujarati Linguistic Minority status granted by Govt. of Maharashtra, 50% of the total seats (30 seats) are reserved for Gujarati Linguistic Minority candidates. Out of these 30 seats, 12 seats are management seats and 18 are for Gujarati category of which 9 seats are for reserved candidates and 9 seats are for open candidates. The rest of 30 seats are filled by Govt. of Maharashtra through Centralised Allotment Process (CAP).

FIRST YEAR CLASS

- Passed the HSC (Std.XII) examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination with -
 - **English as one of the subjects**
 - **All the subjects mentioned under Group – I and**
 - **Any one of the subjects from Group – II**

AND

- Secured minimum 50% marks (45% for backward class candidates from Maharashtra) in Physics, Chemistry and the subject of maximum marks amongst the four subjects of Group-II, added together.

Group – I : (all subjects from this group are compulsory)

1. Physics
2. Chemistry

Group – II : (any one of the subjects from this group)

1. Mathematics
2. Biology
3. Bio-Technology
4. Computer Science

OR

Must have passed Diploma in Pharmacy or its equivalent examination with not less than 50% of marks in the aggregate of all subjects taken together at the Final Year Examination at one and the same sitting.

ORDINANCES AND REGULATIONS

ORDINANCES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR (REVISED COURSE) (SEMESTER I TO VIII) IN VARIOUS BRANCHES.

O.5260 : Eligibility Criteria for Admission at the entry level at Semester-I into the Course.

The candidate should have passed the Higher Secondary Certificate (Std.XII) Examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Pune or its equivalent examination with an in English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology or Mathematics and secured not less than 50 per cent marks (150 out of 300) in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, and Biology or Mathematics taken together at one and the same sitting (45 per cent marks i.e. 135 out of 300 in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together at one and the same sitting for Backward Class candidates only from Maharashtra state).

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Educational Qualification:

In order to secure admission through CAP to first year of four year Degree course in Pharmacy, the candidate should fulfill the following eligibility criteria:

O.5261: Eligibility Criteria for Admission at the entry level of Semester-III (i.e. the first semester of Second Year B.Pharm.Sc.) into the Course.

The candidate who has passed the final examination leading to the Diploma in Pharmacy conducted by the Board of Technical Education, Maharashtra State or equivalent examination from the Institute approved by the Pharmacy Council of India and with a minimum First Year (60% i.e. 600 out of 1000 at Part-II examination for the Diploma in Pharmacy Course) as per ER-91 (i.e. Post H.S.C. Two Year Diploma Course) be held eligible for admission to Semester-III i.e. the first semester of Second Year B.Pharm.Sc. course (subject to availability of seats).

O.5262 Admission authority and procedures at the entry levels into the course.

As per The Government of Maharashtra's Directive prevailing at the time of admission.

O.5263 Continuation into the subsequent semesters after the entry level semesters.

The admitting authority will be The Individual institutes where the candidate has been admitted into the course, and the continuation will be as per the criteria decided by the University for each semester.

Fees :

The fees will be Rs.30,000/- p.a. or as per Government of Maharashtra's directives subject to approval by the concerned Authority. Full fees must be paid along with the necessary deposits as mentioned, at the time of admission. No student will be permitted ordinarily, to appear for any of the University/College Examinations if he/she has not paid the College/Exam fees for the year.

Once admission is granted by the College and if the student cancels the admission for any reason, he/she will not be entitled to refund of the fees already paid by him/her EXCEPT AS PROVIDED BY THE FOLLOWING UNIVERSITY RULES OR AS PER THE LATEST GOVT. DIRECTIVES.

Refund of fees:

The candidate who has confirmed his or her admission may cancel admission by submitting an application in duplicate, in the prescribed proforma, and may request for refund of fees. The refund of fees as applicable shall be made in due course. It is made clear that such application will be considered if and only if the admission taken is confirmed as mentioned in these rules. Refund of tuition fees shall be made after deduction as under :-

Note : In case of candidates belonging to SC / ST / VJ / DT / NT-1 / NT-2 / NT-3 / OBC who have secured a seat, the amount of cancellation fees as specified in Sr.No.1 of the above table is to be levied on the candidates as cancellation charges on cancellation of admission before handing over the original certificates.

O.5264 : Additional Conditions for the Candidates who have entered into the course at Semester-III level as per **O.5261**.

They must keep term for the following subject heads, henceforth referred as remedial subjects, of Semester-I and Semester-II. Accordingly the institutes must arrange the lecture schedules in the respective Semesters such that these candidates can keep term for the subject heads. The institute will devise a mechanism to keep records by way of getting form filled by these candidate for attending the lecture, attendance records, etc. as is done to the regular candidates. However, no additional fees will be charged by the institute.

Remedial Subjects :

The candidates have to appear for examinations in the above subjects heads and also the periodic test. The candidates will be charged separate examination fees. While filling the examination form it should be clearly stated that these candidates are appearing for the examination in the remedial subjects. These subjects and the result will be separately included under the heading Remedial Subjects. In the mark-list of Semester-III for the Subjects of Semester-I and in Semester-IV for the subjects of Semester-II.

The rules for the passing criteria, for the periodic tests will be the same as for the regular candidates. The number of attempts will also be the same as the regular candidates i.e. if a candidate does not pass in these subjects in five attempts including the first attempt they will have to exit the course.

Unless the candidate passes the specified remedial subject heads of the Semester-I they will not be admitted to the Semester-IV and their results of Semester-III will be withheld.

Similarly, unless the candidate passes the specified remedial subject heads of the Semester-II they will not be admitted to the Semester-V and their results of Semester-IV will be withheld.

Examinations:

O.5265 : Examination conducting authority:

Semester-I, Semester-III and Semester-V will be conducted by the Institute where the candidate has been admitted.

Examinations for Semester-II, Semester-IV, Semester-VI, Semester-VII and Semester VIII will be conducted by the University.

O.5266 : Regular and Supplementary Examinations and time :

O.5267 : Criteria for admitting the candidate for examinations irrespective of regular or supplementary examinations:

Candidate must have been admitted to the respective semester as per the criteria for continuation into the respective semesters mentioned above and has kept the term for the semester for which he is examined.

The candidate must submit prescribed application form along with fees.

Candidate must appear for the examination in the place and time as decided by the admitting Institute/University as the case may be.

Candidate who has failed in a particular semester or has ATKT will be allowed to appear for the same examination on a new application being forwarded and a fresh fee paid.

Clarifications :

Candidates who have ATKT will appear for examinations in only those subject heads in which the candidate has failed.

Those candidates who have passed in all the subjects but failed due to not getting over all 50% marks will be allowed to appear in any number of subject heads the candidate desires except the subject head "Seminar".

For all the remaining cases, the candidate has to appear for examination in all those subject heads in which the candidate has failed.

The facility of verification giving of photocopy and revaluation of answer books for all theory examinations conducted by the College on behalf of the University of Mumbai will be as per the rules of the University.

R. 4379 : Periodic Tests : To ensure uniform attention of the students of their work throughout each semester of their study, Periodic tests will be conducted for each semester and :

Conducting authority for all the eight semesters : Institutes conducting the course.

Number of Tests : One periodic test as per the examination scheme (See Annexure-I), for each semester.

Time Schedule : After completion of at least two thirds of the semester instruction weeks.

If the student wishes to appear for the periodic test, he/she shall be allowed to reappear for the periodic test in various Semesters subject to the condition that he/she declared to have failed or ATKT of the examination/s.

Any candidate remaining absent for the test for any reason whatsoever will be treated as not appeared for the test and no separate examination will be conducted. Only not appeared in the test will be mentioned in the mark sheet and the maximum marks prescribed for this test will be counted in the Semester aggregate.

The institute conducting the course must submit the periodic test marks of the respective semester to the Controller of Examinations before the commencement of theory or practical examination whichever is later.

R. 4380 : **Marks, Criteria for passing and other conditions.**

1. Passing criteria for each subject head:

Maximum marks for each subject head, and minimum for passing the each subject head – See Examination scheme Annexure-I.

Candidate will be considered as passed in the subject head when the candidate fulfills the following two criteria considered together. 1. Has got Minimum marks prescribed for the semester examination and 2. Has got Minimum marks prescribed for combined semester and periodic test. See Annexure-I.

Candidate will be considered as failed in the subject head if the candidate does not fulfill criteria 1 or 2 or both given in paragraph 11.6.1.2 above.

No separate passing is required for periodic test and if the candidate remains absent for the test, the candidate will be just treated as not appeared for the test and treated at par with other candidates who have appeared for all the test.

If a candidate's applications form for reappearing in the examination in a subject head is accepted, and the candidate appears in the examination fresh marks will be considered and the candidate forfeits the marks obtained in the previous examinations in that subject head and those marks will not be reconsidered for any purpose again under any circumstances whatsoever.

Examination of the Subject head “Seminar” will be conducted by the institute. The criteria for evaluation and marks distribution is specified in the syllabus. The institute must submit the marks awarded in the seminar to the controller of examination along with the periodic test marks. Once the candidate has passed in the subject head Seminar the candidate will not be allowed to reappear for examination in this subject head.

2. Passing of the semester :

Candidate will be considered as **passed the semester** only when the candidate passes in all the subject heads and obtains overall a minimum of 50% of the aggregate marks prescribed for the semester (see Annexure-I).

3. Award of the degree and Class.

Degree will be awarded to the candidates who have passed all the eight semesters.

Class will be awarded to those candidates who have passed the Semester-VII in one and the same sitting and VIII also in one and the same sitting, and on the basis of combined marks at the Semester-VII and VIII and the classes are as under :

I.	Those obtaining 50 per cent and above but below 60 per cent of the total marks	Second Class
II.	Those obtaining 60 per cent and above but below 70 per cent of the total marks	First Class
III.	Those obtaining 70 per cent of the total marks and above	First Class with distinction.

Such candidates who have not passed the Semester-VII and / or VIII in one sitting and desire to get class awarded will be permitted to reappear the examination in all the subject heads on payment of fees with fresh application. Such candidates will be treated at par with fresh candidates and result of this examination will only be considered for all purposes. **However, the candidate will forfeit all the previous marks and result of all the subject heads of the semester of which he has reappeared for the examination.**

The periodic test marks will be carried forward.

R. 4381 : Number of attempts :

A candidate is allowed a maximum of five attempts inclusive of first attempt to pass respective Semester failing which the candidate has to discontinue the course.

The same criteria of maximum attempts applies to remedial subject heads as well as for the candidate who have entered the course at Semester-III level as per **O.5261**.

R.4382 : Withholding of results.

A candidates result will be withheld under the following situations and of the respective Semester.

Result of Semester III will be withheld if the candidate has not passed Semester-I.

Result of Semester IV will be withheld if the candidate has not passed Semester-I and Semester-II

Result of Semester-V will be withheld if the candidate has not passed Semester-I, Semester-II and Semester-III

Result of Semester-VI will be withheld if the candidate has not passed Semester-I, Semester-II, Semester-III and Semester-IV

Result of Semester-VII will be withheld if the candidate has not passed Semester-I, Semester-II, Semester-III, Semester-IV and Semester-V.

Result of Semester-VIII will be withheld if the candidate has not passed Semester-I, Semester-II, Semester-III, Semester-IV, Semester-V, Semester-VI and Semester-VII.

R. 4383 : Allowed to keep terms (ATKT) rules

ATKT rules are applicable only to those candidates who have appeared for the examination in all the subject heads.

Further, to be eligible for ATKT candidates must secure minimum 50% of the semester aggregate marks irrespective of whether the candidate has appeared or not appeared in periodic test in some subject heads.

Number of subjects:

Semester	Number of Subject heads for ATKT
I, III, V	Will be awarded to those candidates who have failed in not more than two subject heads.
II, IV, VI	Will be awarded to the candidates who have failed in not more than three subject heads.

R.4384 : Candidates who remains absent for the examinations/periodic tests:

If a candidate does not appear for examinations in one or more subject heads in which the candidate's form is accepted for the examination the candidate will be declared as failed and is not eligible for ATKT (see under ATKT rules above). If a candidate having ATKT remains absent in the subsequent examinations the ATKT continues. If the candidate remains absent for the periodic test, the candidate will be treated at par with the candidate who appeared for the test.

R. 4385 : Exemption to appear for the examination:

If a Candidate has got ATKT, the candidate will be exempted for appearing the examination for those subject heads in which the candidate has passed.

If a candidate has passed in all the subjects but failed due to not getting 50% of the aggregate marks may appear for the examination in any number of subject heads the candidate desires except the subject head "Seminar", so as to get over all 50% marks, in such cases fresh marks obtained in the subject heads the candidate has appeared for the examination will only be considered irrespective of marks obtained in the previous examination and fresh result will be declared. For example, if the candidate gets over all 50% marks but fails in one of the subject heads in which the candidate had passed earlier, the candidate will be treated as failed in that subject head and result will be declared as per the rules applicable to the failed candidates. The marks in which the candidate has not appeared for the examination will be carried forward.

R. 4386 : Every candidate shall be required to work for at least four weeks in a Pharmaceutical Industry or Govt. Hospital at the end of the Semester-VI of the course of study, and shall submit satisfactory report of such work to the head of the candidate's institute.

COLLEGE DISCIPLINE

1. The college attaches great importance to discipline and the same must be scrupulously observed by all the students. Failure to comply with any of the rules, regulations or requirements notified from time to time will led to strict disciplinary action.
2. Students must always keep with them the Identity Card issued by the college with their recent photograph affixed, bearing the signature of the Principal. They must present it for inspection or verification whenever demanded by the College Authorities and / or Security Staff. No student shall be allowed to attend lectures, practicals etc. unless he/she has his/her Identity Card with him/her.
3. Students should make use of the college library and must not loiter in the college premises whenever they have a free period.
4. Students must be in their classes in time. Late comers may not be allowed to enter the classes.
5. Students must do nothing either inside or outside the college that will in any way interfere with its orderly administration and discipline. They should not communicate any information or write anything about the college to the press without the written permission of the Principal.
6. Students are liable to lose their term for disobedience, misconduct, misbehaviour or for any act of indiscipline.
7. Students must take proper care of all the college property. Any damage done to the property of the college by disfiguring walls, doors, windows and fitting or breaking furniture and such other things is breach of discipline and will be punishable as such. Smoking, Tobacco-Chewing, Drugs etc. are strictly prohibited in the college premises.

8. Use of mobile Phones, Pagers, Walkman etc. in the college premises is strictly prohibited.
9. Students will not misbehave in any manner anywhere in the college campus nor wear any improper dress while in the college and its premises and would maintain descent behaviour and shall uphold the dignity of the college wherever he/she may be.
10. No picnics, socials, excursion or tours shall be arranged without the prior written permission of the Principal. If students join an unofficial picnic or tour, the college shall not be responsible for anything that happens in the picnic or tour.

COLLEGE REGULATIONS

General

1. All students are responsible to the Principal, the Vice Principals and members of the staff for their conduct in the Public.
2. Insubordination, abusive language or misbehaviour, misconduct can lead to the dismissal of a student.
3. Demonstration of any kind in the college is strictly prohibited.
4. In case of sickness, a leave application shall be submitted to the college office along with a medical certificate within two days of resuming the college. Fitness certificate at the time of resuming the college is essential.
5. All the receipts on account of the fines imposed on students for any cause whatsoever shall accrue to the Students' Aid Fund of the College.
6. All students applying for Bonafide Certificate, Character Certificate, Birth Date Certificates, Testimonials etc. and requiring the Principal or Vice Principal's signature on any kind of document or application should first contact the Clerk in the College Office. No papers should be taken by the students directly to the Principal or the Vice Principals.

LIBRARY

The Library is well equipped with books and journals. There is a spacious reading room. It is open from 8.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. The library also has a facility of Home-Lending system against reader's tickets.

MISCELLANEOUS:

- The medium of instruction for degree course in Pharmacy in all the Universities is English.
- Admission of candidate who has been admitted to the college will be treated as finally confirmed only after enrolment / final Eligibility Certificate is received from the University to which the college is affiliated and the final approval to the admitted candidates from the Directorate of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, Mumbai.
- Physical Fitness : Head of the institution at his or her discretion may refer any candidate to the appropriate medical authority for ascertaining the physical fitness of the candidate to undergo the requirements of the course. The report of medical authority shall be submitted to the Regional Head of Technical Education for further necessary action. It is to be noted that physically handicapped candidates are not provided with any additional facilities as far as the academic activities pertaining to the course are concerned.
- Head of the institution, if required, may verify the antecedents of any candidate through the appropriate police authority. The report received from police authority shall be submitted to the Regional Head of Technical Education for further necessary action.

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

- Notwithstanding anything contained in these Rules, if the Govt. takes any policy decision pertaining to First Year Pharmacy admission, then the same shall be brought in to effect at that point of time as per the directives from the Govt. from time to time.
- The students while studying in any college, if found indulging in anti-national activities contrary to the provision of Acts and Laws enforced by Government or in any activity contrary to rules of discipline, will be liable to be expelled from the college without any notice by the Principal of the College.
- **Action against ragging : Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 which is in effect from 15th May 1999 has the following provisions for Action against Ragging.**
 - (a) Ragging within or outside of any educational institution is prohibited.
 - (b) Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets, or propagates ragging within or outside any educational institution shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term up to 2 years and / or penalty which may extend to ten thousand rupees.

- (c) Any student convicted of an offence of ragging shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such students shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of five years from the date of order of such dismissal.
 - (d) Whenever any student or, as the case may be, the parent or guardian or a teacher of an educational institution complains, in writing, of ragging to the head of the educational institution, the head of the educational institution shall, without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, within seven days of the receipt of the complaint, enquire into the matter mentioned in the complaint and if, prima facie, it is found true, suspend the student who is accused of the offence, and shall, immediately forward the complaint to the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the educational institution is situated, for further action. Where, on enquiry by the head of the educational institution, it is found that there is no substance, prima facie, in the complaint received, he/she shall intimate the fact, in writing, to the complainant. The decision of the head of the educational institution shall be final.
 - (e) If the head of the educational institution fails or neglects to act in the manner specified in section “d” above when a complaint of ragging is made, such person shall be deemed to have abetted the offence and shall, on conviction, be punished as provided for in section “b” above.
- If any of the statement made in application form or any information supplied by the candidate in connection with his or her admission is later on at any time, found to be false or incorrect, his or her admission will be cancelled, fees forfeited and he or she may be expelled from the college by the Principal. An appeal against the order of expulsion, however, may be preferred within 7 days to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, Mumbai, whose decision in such cases will be final.

TERM GRANT AND EXAMINATIONS

1. To keep a term at a college or recognized institution, an undergraduate must complete to the satisfaction of the Principal or the Head of the institution, the course of study at the college or institution prescribed for such terms for the class to which such undergraduate then belongs.
2. Although illness or other serious circumstances may be considered valid for the absence from lectures, tests, tutorials. The circumstances cannot condone a student for poor performance or absence from examination. Accordingly, students with poor records of academic performance will not be granted terms.
3. Students who have not been granted term will not be permitted to appear at the First term / Second term / Annual Examination conducted by the College or by the University.

There will be an examination at the end of each semester. The University of Mumbai will hold the examinations at the end of Semesters II, IV, VI, VII, VIII. The examinations at the end of Semester I, III and V will be held by the College on behalf of the University of Mumbai according to University of Mumbai rules.

ATTENDANCE

- For granting the terms in each subject minimum attendance of 75% of the theory lectures, practicals and tutorials (wherever prescribed) separately will be required out of the total number of lectures, practicals and tutorials in the subject conducted in the terms.

HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation cannot be guaranteed to all the candidates admitted. Hostel fees payable etc. should be ascertained by the students from the Principal of the college on admission. The candidates (both boys and girls) are advised to verify personally whether the hostel accommodation is available or not, by contacting Principals of colleges where they are intending to seek admission. The Principal of the colleges shall consider sympathetically or priority the applications of physically handicapped candidates, sons and daughters of Jammu and Kashmir migrants and Gol nominees.
